We experienced a very challenging 2015, trying to work remotely without the amenities of an office. We now have a new office administrator as Nancy has moved on. We wish Nancy well and thank her for her years of service. I take this opportunity to introduce Denyse Dehler who has assisted us for the past 10 months. Denyse has a strong union background and is very keen to help us improve our operation while using her technological knowledge.

The Maritime Labour Centre is slowly being put back together after the fire of January 2015, however we are told the work will not be complete until May at the earliest. We will continue to hold our general business meetings at the Maritime Labour Centre, however please keep in mind that the Canada Way location remains our permanent home for at least the next few years. There are a couple of organizations who are showing interest in buying our shares; we will keep you informed on any progress with the sale of these shares.

Meridian is currently finishing off a major project in the shop, additionally they are involved with work for BC Ferries taking place at Deas Dock. Financial problems in China have caused a slowdown in our scrap yards. We hope the slowdown will be short-lived.

We will be back at the bargaining table in June with ABC Recycling, DBC Marine Safety, and Osborne Propellers.

We have updated the website to encourage non-members to visit and see what trades are in demand through our employers.

I have been visiting worksites with Brother MacPherson, meeting both members and employers. The Marine Workers & Boilermakers are very happy to have welcomed new members, many of them painters. We hope to see these new brothers and sisters at our general business meetings.

We are currently organizing the new office, starting from scratch after the loss of our furniture and many of our files and taking the opportunity to set up filing systems with some emphasis on more digital systems to cut down on paper.

If you become unemployed, please contact the Union so that you may be placed in the system as available for work. Most employers do not inform us of layoffs and if you are not registered you may be missing out on work. We also ask that if you get hurt at work and go onto Workers Compensation, that you advise the Union in order for us to change your status. If you are on WCB and have some questions regarding your claims you can contact the union office. Always be aware of timelines involved if you are appealing a decision made by the Board.
