PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

The second year of the Covid Pandemic continued to create challenges for most of our certifications and members. The Omicron strain of the virus seemed to spread very quickly causing more missed work than the previous strain, however this wave of the pandemic did not shutdown any of the certifications. Some General Business Meetings were also cancelled due to the virus, however Executive meetings continued via TEAM to maintain the needs of the Union. We were disappointed having to cancel our retirees' luncheon for the second year in a row, hopefully we will be able to gather this December.

It appears the initial slowdown of work caused by COVID quickly rebounded and once again the Union is actively looking for skilled tradespeople for several of its certifications.

The Maritime Labour Centre's flood protection construction completed this year in the downstairs of the building were successful as everything stayed dry during the atmospheric river event in the fall.

In 2021 Collective Agreements were settled at Enermax Mfg, Allied Shipbuilders, Osborne Propellers and Linde (formerly Praxair). There are quite a few negotiations taking place in 2022.

Employers denying the five sick days are being challenged one by one as it is our opinion that most of our Collective Agreements do not "meet or exceed" provisions within the new legislation in the ESA.

We would like to thank all of those who volunteered their time to participate in union labour training in the last year and wish to recognize all our members

who volunteer as Shop Stewards and/or on JOSH Committees and Bargaining Committees The Trustees of the Health and Welfare and Pension plans meet regularly with the administrator and actuaries to monitor the needs and ongoing performance of the investment of the plans.

On a very sad note, Brother Peter Borzillo passed away on January 14, 2022. Peter was a longtime member of the Marine Workers and was the Secretary Treasurer for many years. I had the pleasure of working with him at Allied Shipbuilders and learned a tremendous amount from him during our time together on the Executive Board. Peter was always quick to reach out and help anyone in need, he will be greatly missed.

VDC continues to be busy albeit with a cumulative decrease in working hours in the last two years. It is not surprising that 2019 was an especially busy year including cruise ship projects, which is currently non-existent because of COVID.

VDC is currently undergoing some upgrades which Seaspan hopes will include the addition of two drydocks. Seaspan has applied to the Port of Vancouver to expand its VDC facility to the west of its existing facility.

Management and the Union faced each other again at arbitrations in 2021 debating key issues, resulting in favourable outcomes for our members. We have part two of a key arbitration scheduled this month to deal with our unresolved grievance on contracting out work traditionally performed by our painters and sandblasters.

MAVERICK HYDRODEMOLITION SERVICES

Maverick joined us in 2019, our members have gone from performing 50% of the UHP to 100%. While some painters/ sandblasters have chosen not to perform ultra-high blasting, most have. Our first collective agreement was produced without any issues arising from the exercise.
